More Mystery Items

Hog Nose Pliers




Figure 1 Mystery Pliers

As shown in Figures 1 to 3, the mystery pliers can be found by searching under "Hog Nose". The search includes Fig 3 which is a pig's nose with rings (really clips) attached. These grisly devices stop pigs from rooting the ground with their noses. Worse than just seeing the innocent pigs, if you click on a You-Tube link you can see (AND HEAR) the clips being applied! Not recommended!

Wedge Grip Driver (?)

The next item (Figures 4 and 5) is labeled "wedge grip" and has a provisional patent number of 3843/39. A search of this number did not provide a solution.
